Sabrina pushed her lips out in a sexy 'O' and then unleashed the hurricane from her lungs, the entire area taken over by a loud gushing sound.

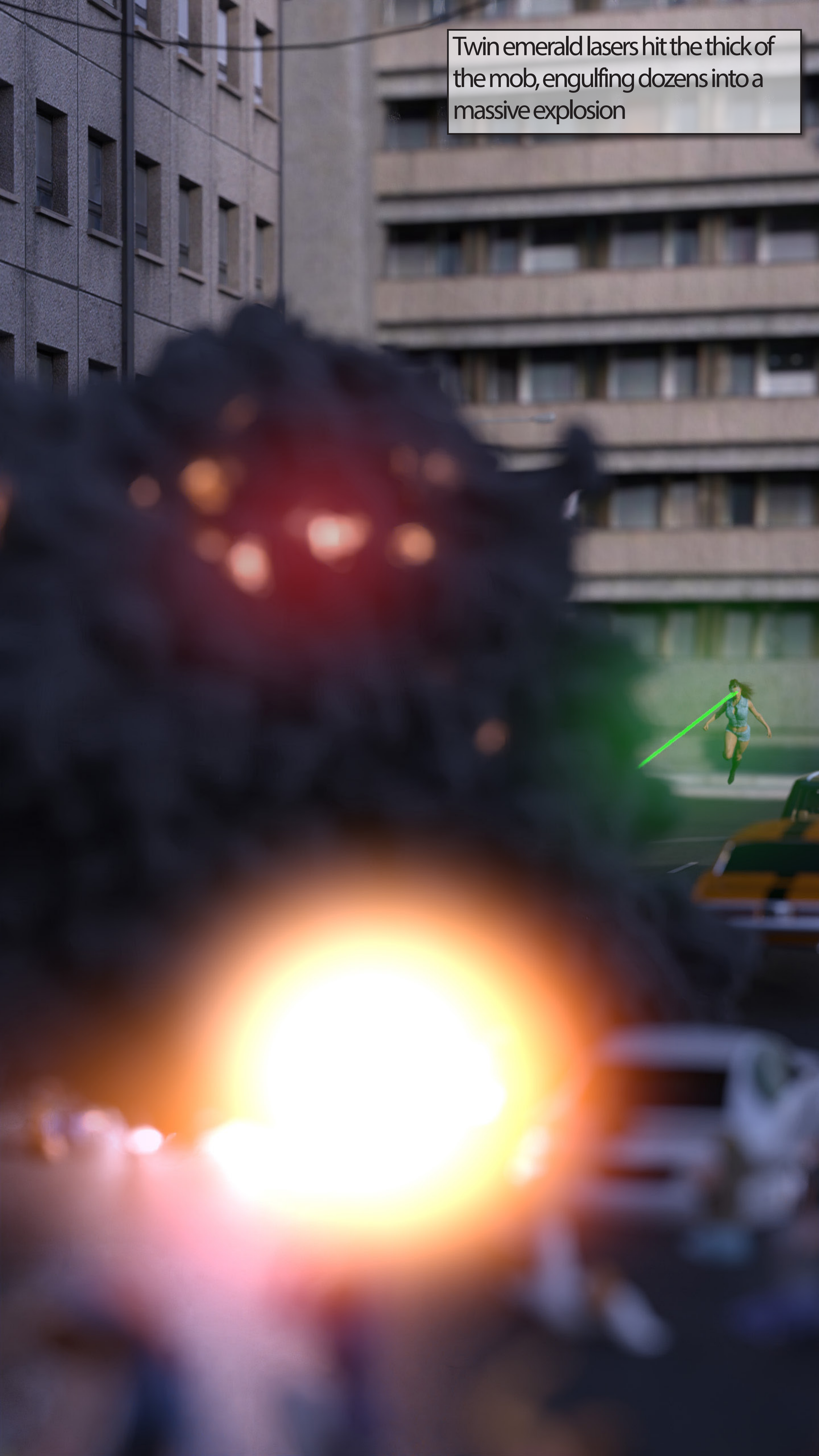


The wavefront soon hit the mob, the gale-forced winds tossing people around like rag dolls, clearing the road immediately ahead of her.

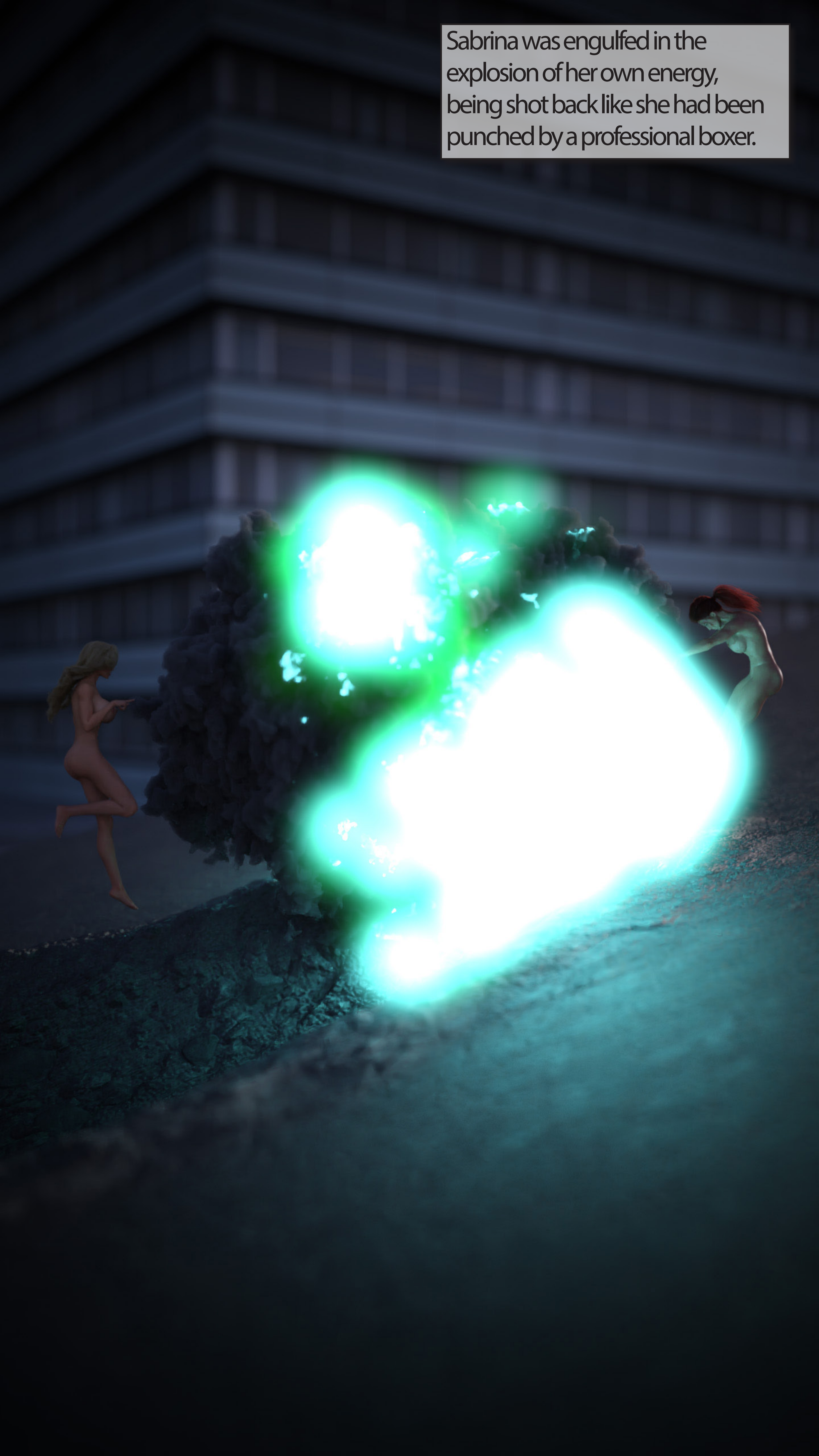
“So, yeah, still have some powers. Just quite pathetic, I see,” Aditi kept mocking as she seemed not even to struggle to contain her attack.

"I can't believe that you thought you could take what's mine," Aditi said.

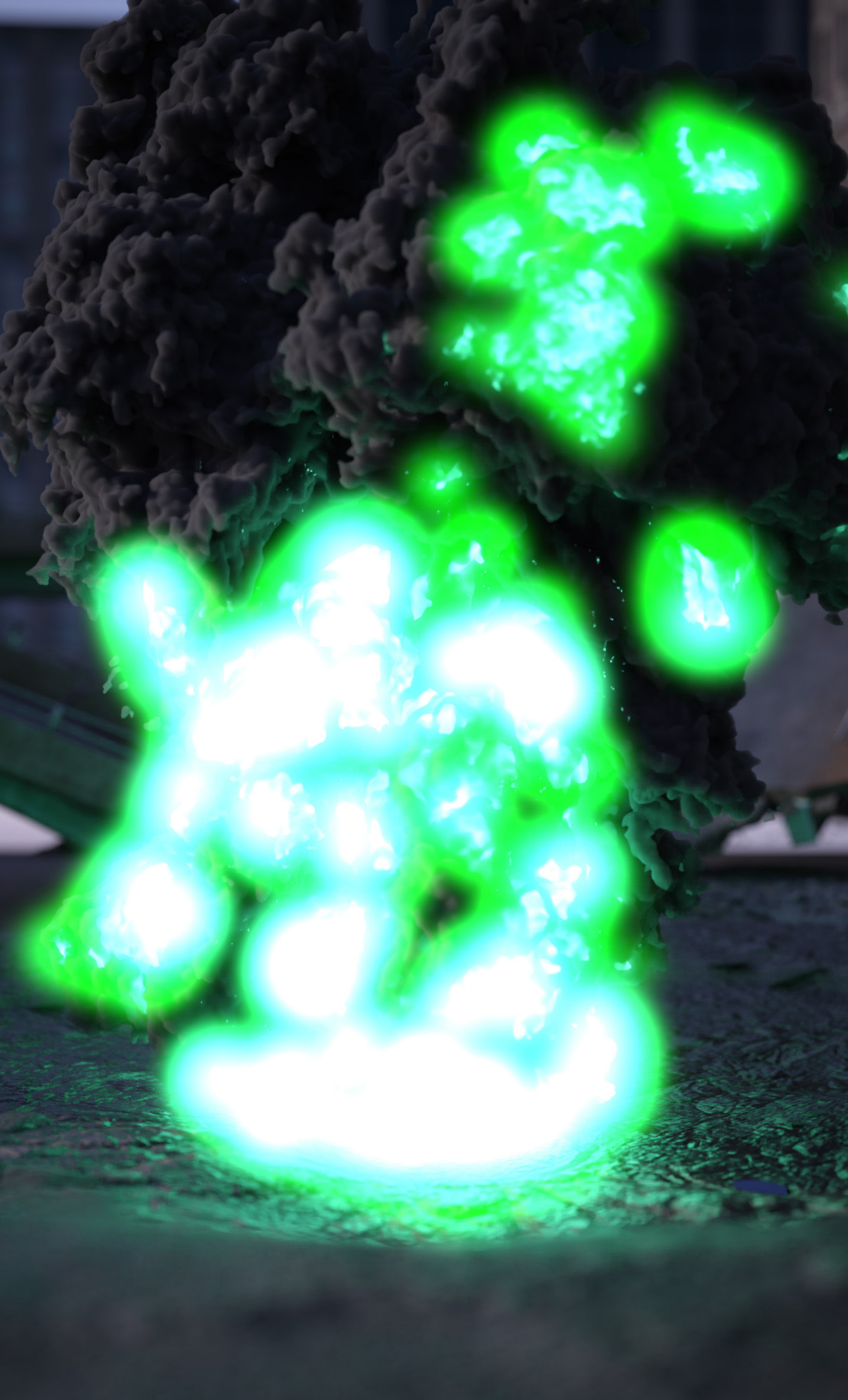


Lifting her from the ground, she clenched her fist, ready to deliver the final blow. "Bye, Sabrina!"
