

Chapter Thirteen

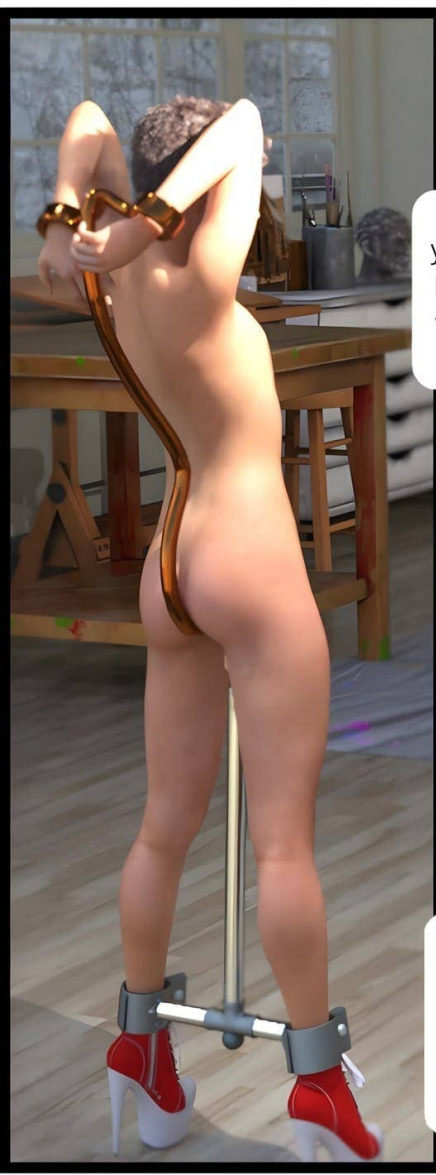


Conjugal Visit

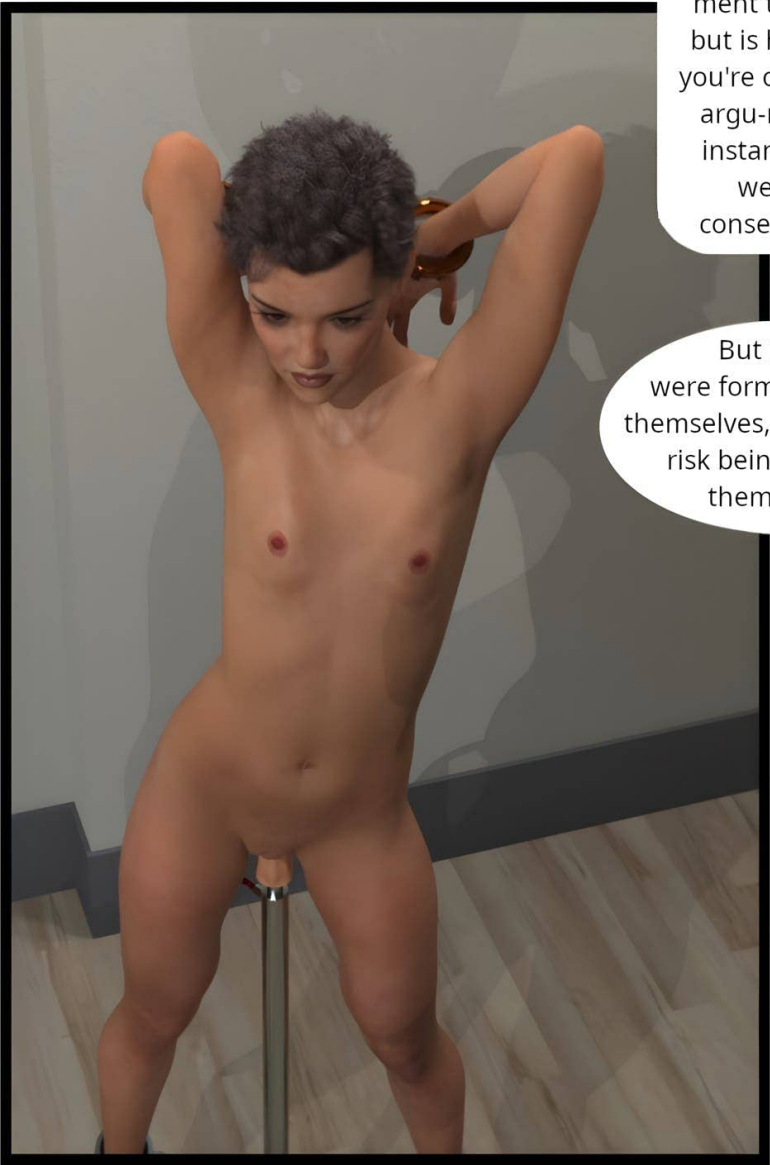
Of course it's wrong! But can you really look at that cute little thing standing over there and tell me you're not glad to be living in an age of slavery?

In this way, they try to avoid suspicion, and they are able to guide the investigation away from themselves, until they find a suitable patsy to satisfy those eager for revenge. Many political leaders are of this nature. People like that are often drawn to such professions, because of the power it gives them to act out on their impulses--on a massive scale. And, by controlling the narrative, they can work up their hapless followers into a delusional frenzy, turning them into foot soldiers to enforce their projection and work their will.

I find it very hard to believe what you're saying.

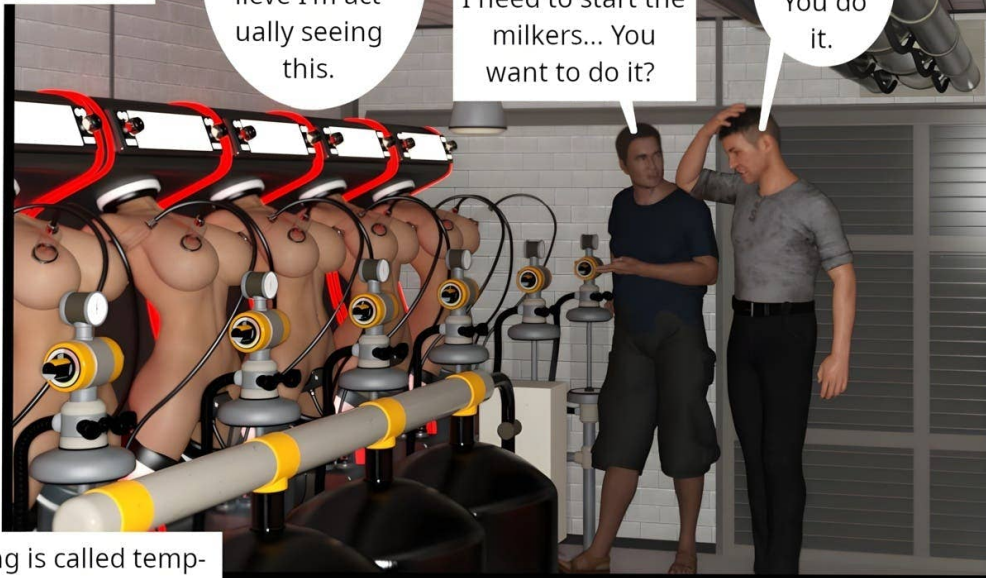

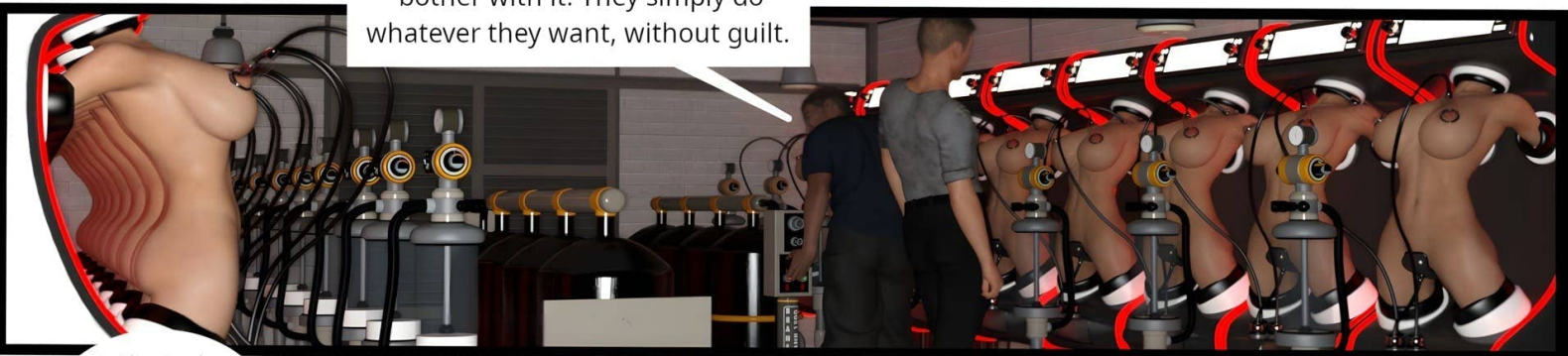


Holy shit. I know you're a dairy, but I can't believe I'm actually seeing this.

No, I'm good. You do it.

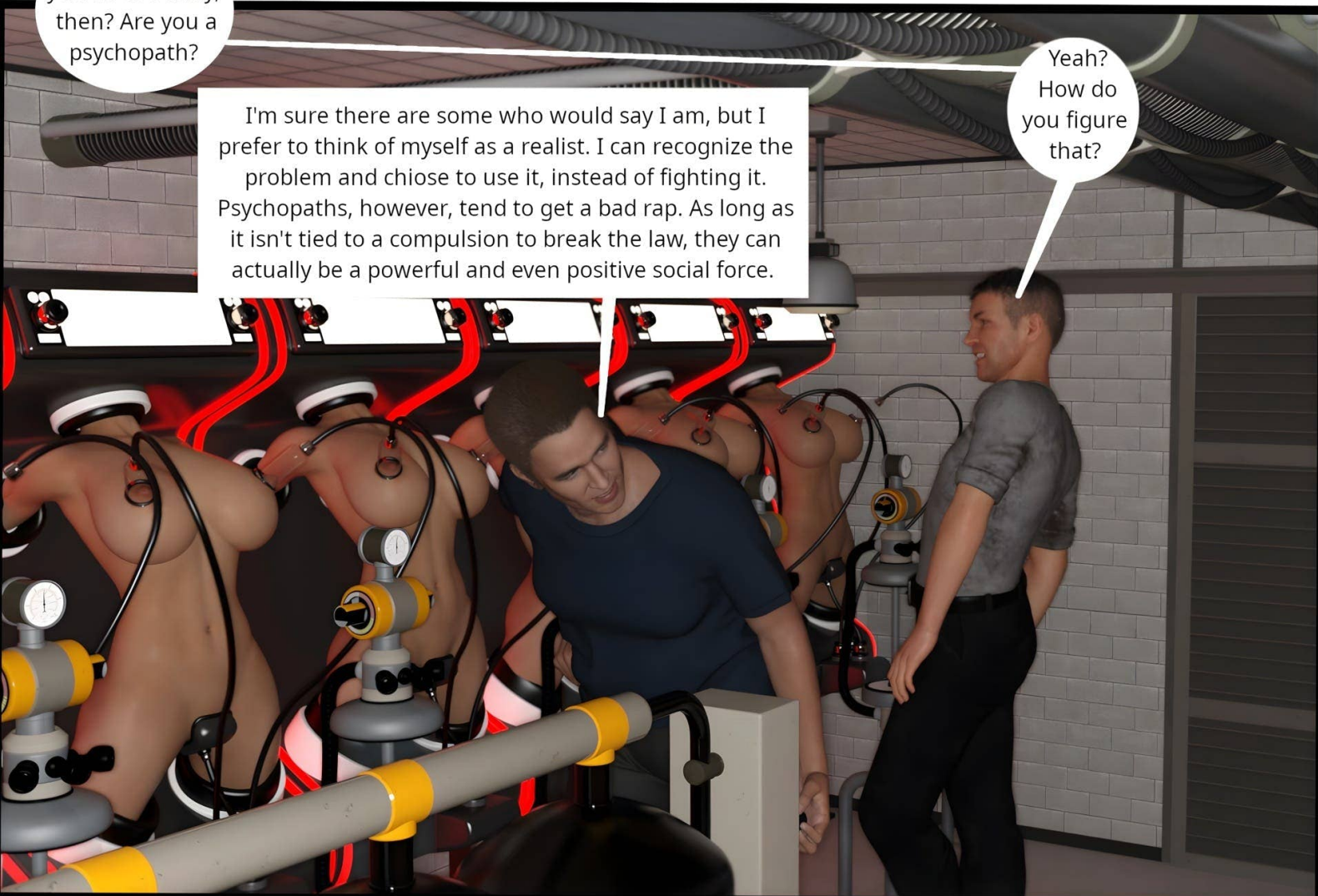
What you're feeling is called temptation. Psychopaths don't have to bother with it. They simply do whatever they want, without guilt.

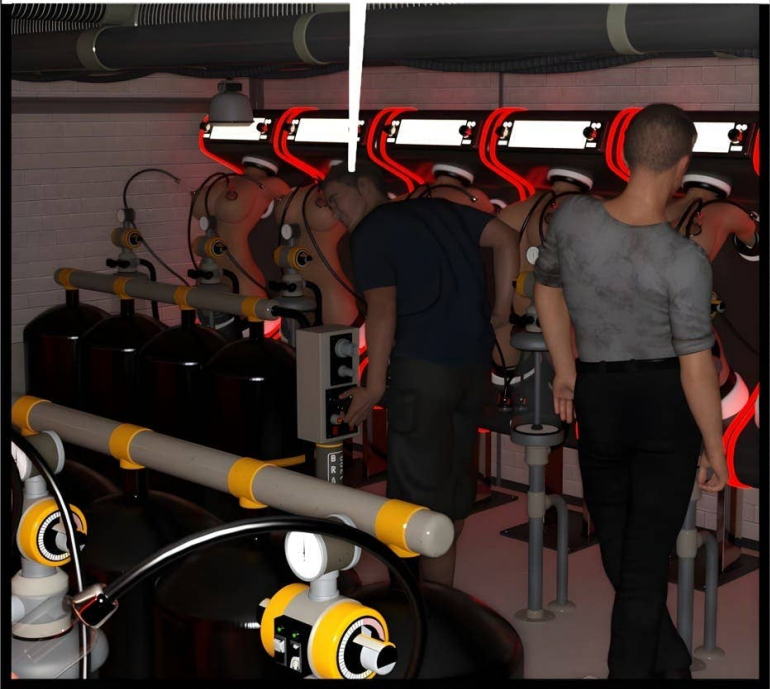
But far more often, they become a businessman or a politician--providing society with the structure and security it needs to exist, because they covet power and wealth.

The lion oppresses the deer it kills, yet killing some means the rest won't over-populate & cause all to starve.

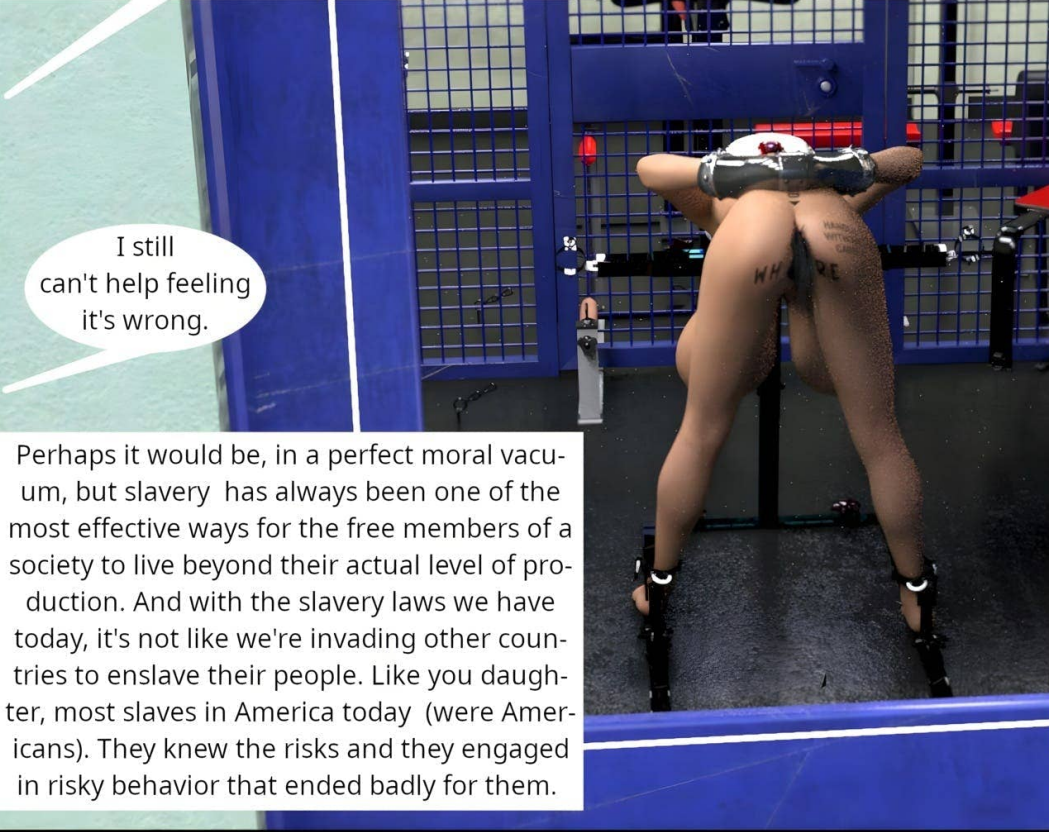
But, how can it be good, if they do bad. If they oppress.

That's **why** they seek out power. Which means that any government, no matter how perfectly organized or benevolently minded it starts out will inevitably move towards corruption. It's always moving towards that fallen state. People with a conscience, however, will only take so much before they begin to rebel... and, occasionally, they even manage to make things better. It's not just the slavery, you know. I...

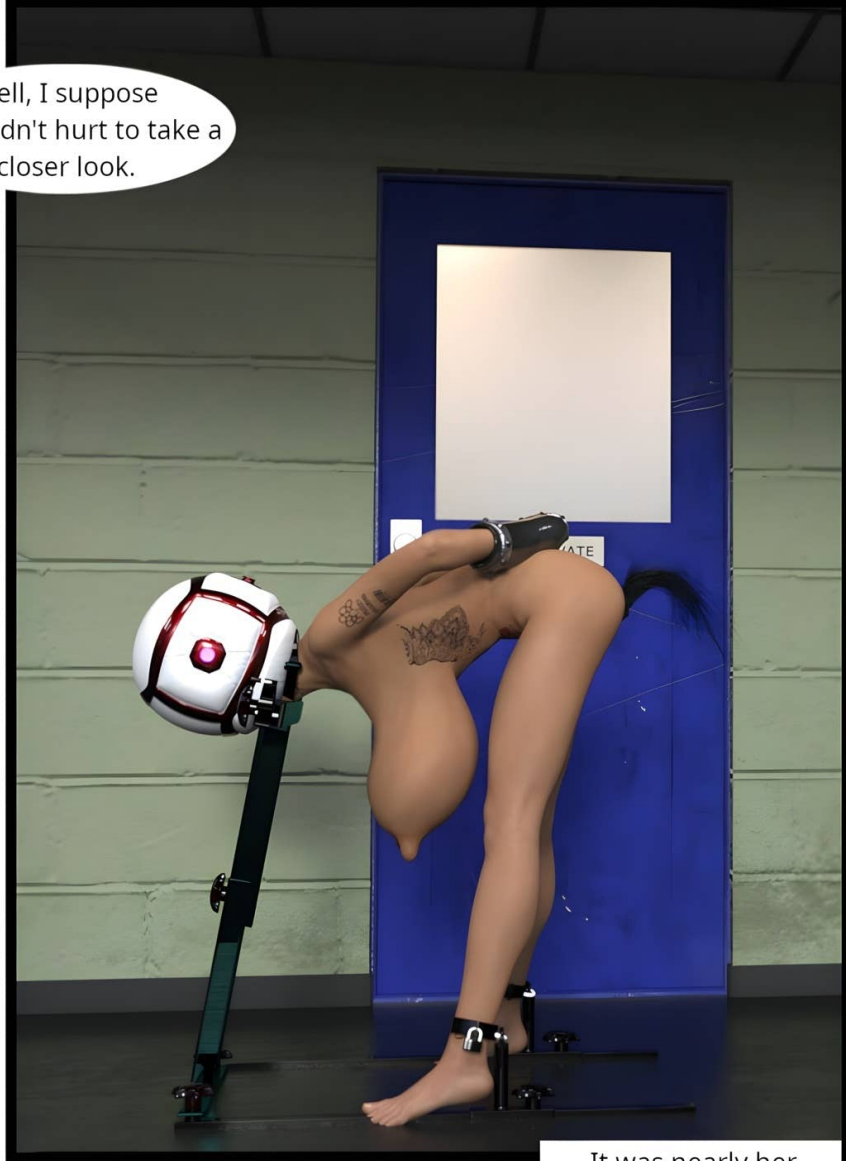
I can't!

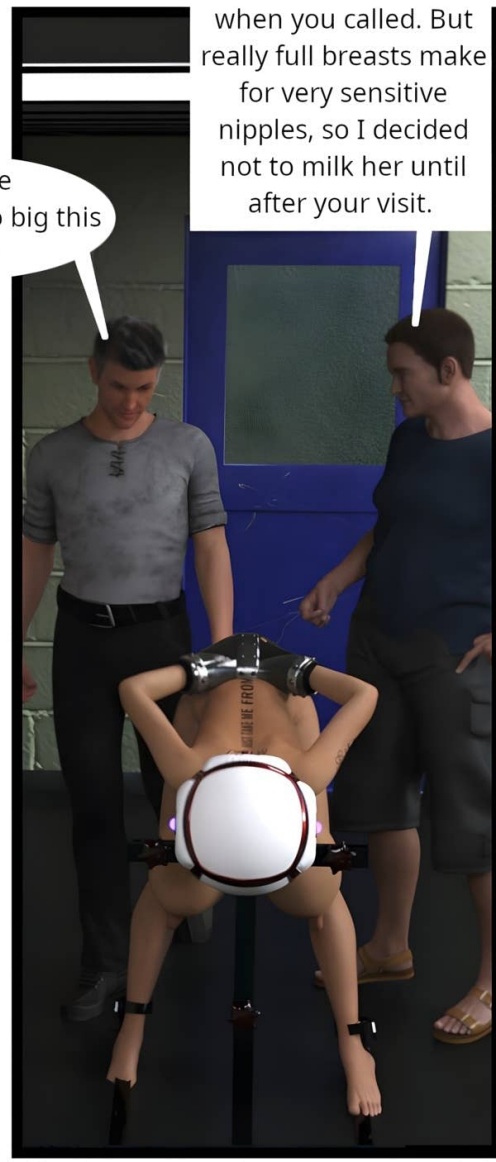
Well, I suppose it wouldn't hurt to take a closer look.



It was nearly her milking time yesterday when you called. But really full breasts make for very sensitive nipples, so I decided not to milk her until after your visit.



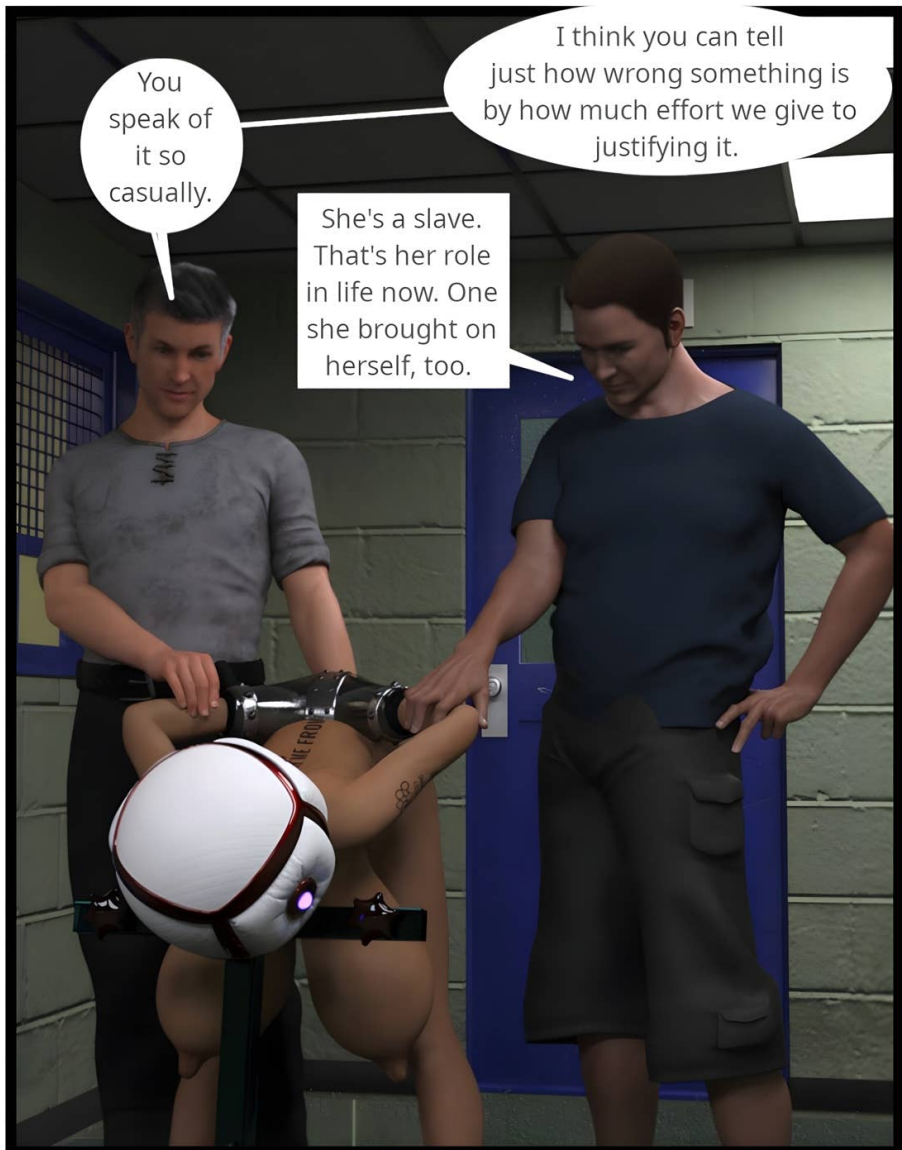
Why are her breasts so big this time?

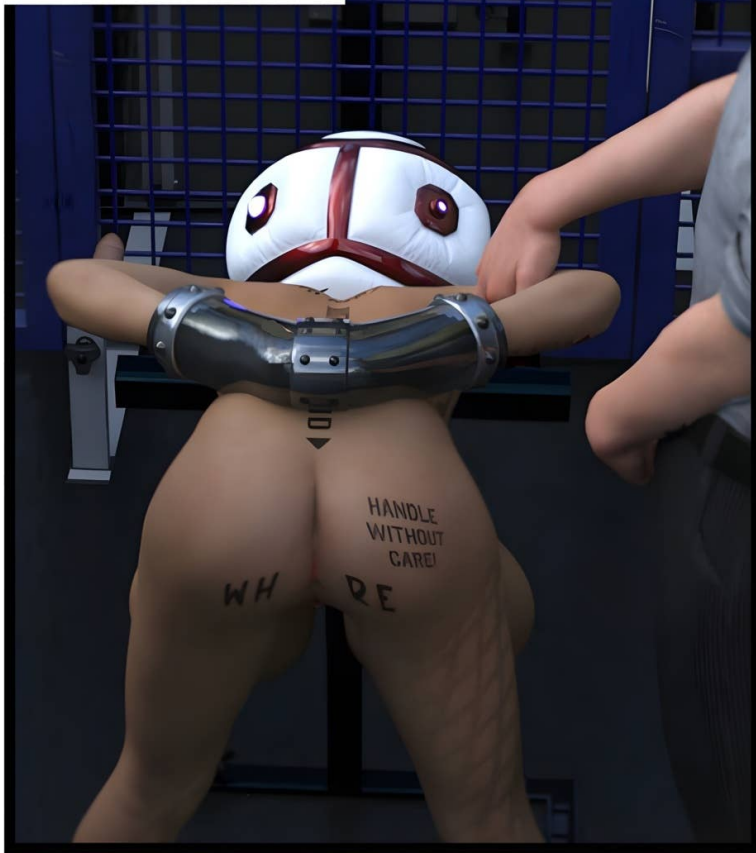


Thanks for the heads up. And when I'm done? What should I do?
